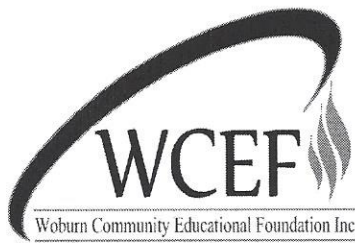

WCEF granted me the money to purchase 4 Kindle e-readers. Using these Kindles as learning tools in addition to what is already being used in the classroom, sparked an interest in and a desire for technology in the classroom. Since first getting these 4 Kindles, we as a school have more than doubled our inventory. We have 12 Kindles that are shared amongst the teachers on a daily basis. We also purchased a Kindle friendly reading comprehension program for grades 1, 2, + 3. WCEF funded what ^{has} become a huge forward movement in technology at the Winscott.

One major setback has been dead-zones within our school. This prevents wifi access and therefore prevents use of Kindles in certain rooms. We are working with the technology dept. w/in WPS to try to fix this issue.

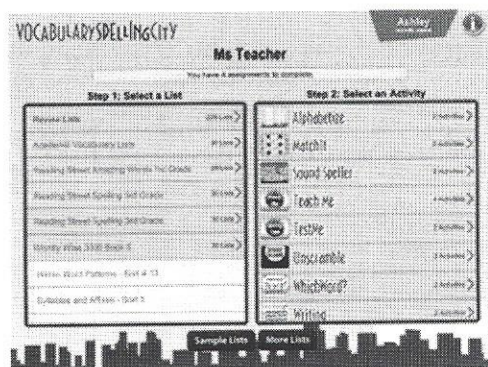

I've entered spelling and reading vocabulary words for second grade

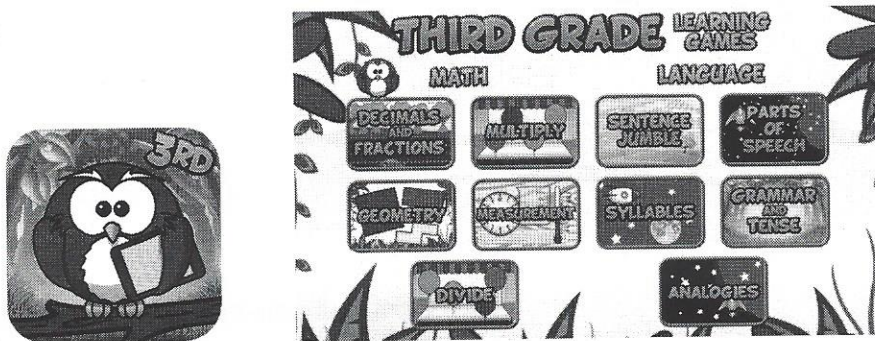

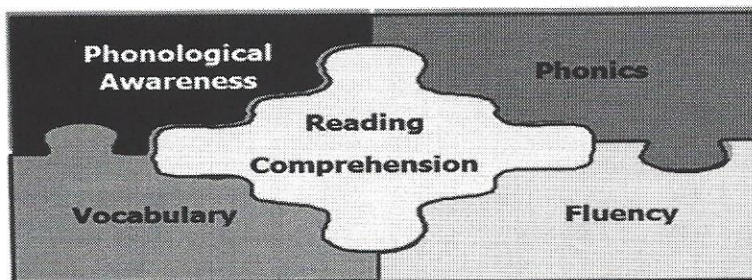

Essential Components in Reading

Effective, comprehensive, reading instruction includes instruction in each of the essential components:



Without comprehension, reading is simply following words on a page from left to right while sounding them out. The words on the page have no meaning. And while people read for many different reasons, the chief goal is to derive some understanding of what the writer is trying to convey and make use of that information – whether for fact gathering, learning a new skill, or for pleasure. That's why reading comprehension skills are so important. Without them the reader cannot gather any information and use it to efficiently function and enjoy the richness of life.

The lack of strong reading comprehension skills obviously affects a student's success in school. Academic progress depends on understanding, analyzing, and applying the information gathered through reading.

Reading is a multifaceted process that develops ONLY with practice.

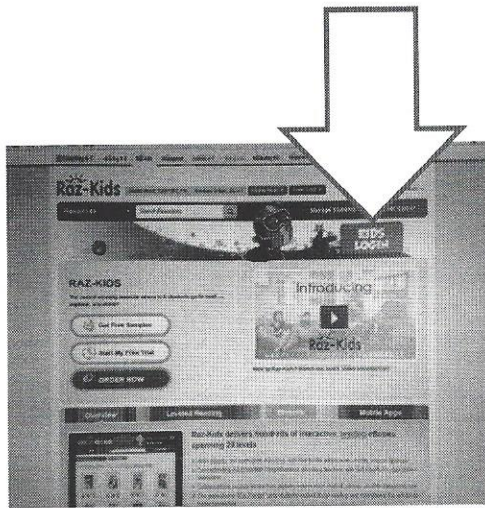

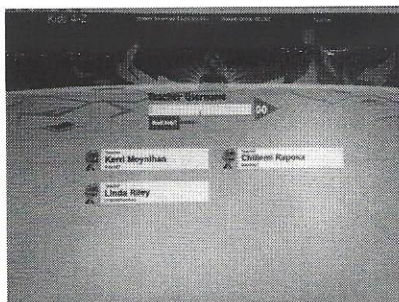
You will be brought to the page below. Select your teacher or click on pick a different teacher if you do not see your child's classroom teacher.

Grade 2 teacher username = linscottg2

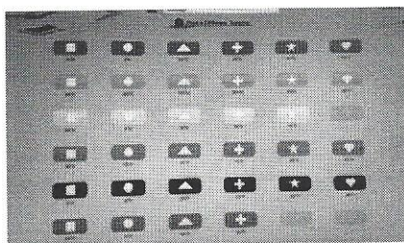
Grade 3 teacher username = linscottg3

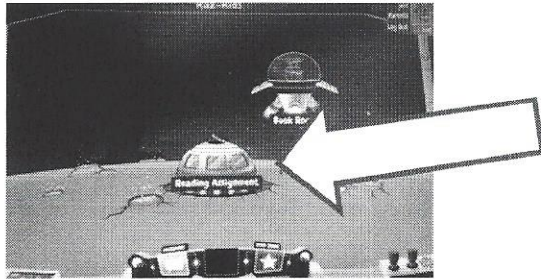
You will then see a page similar to the page below.

Click on your child's initials. Your child should recognize his/her color, shape, and initials easily.

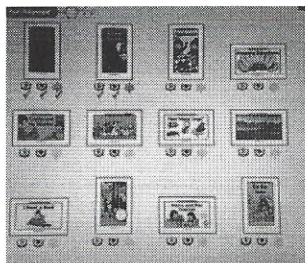


You will then be brought to the following page.

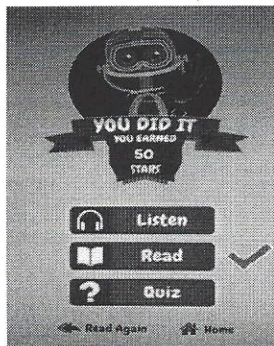
Click on Reading Assignment. Your child's teacher has assigned your child a specific level based on comprehension.



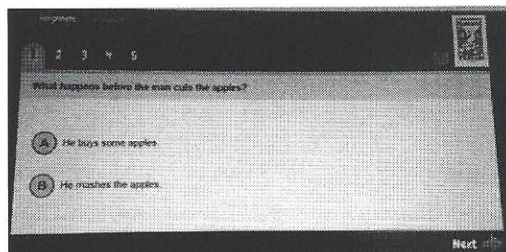
The reading assignment room will look like the following image. Your child can choose a book that he/she would be interested in reading. **Your child should click on the eye!!! This is important because we are encouraging reading for comprehension, not listening (ear icon).



After reading the selected book, your child will see the following. 'Read' will be checked. Your child should then select 'Quiz'.



A five or ten question quiz will appear on the screen similar to the following image. After answering all questions, your child should click 'done' and he/she will be able to see his/her score. He/she will also be able to correct any questions that are incorrect.



Your child has been using this at school and we are asking you to please encourage him/her to use it at home! It can be accessed on a computer, IPad, Kindle, and even on a smartphone!
