

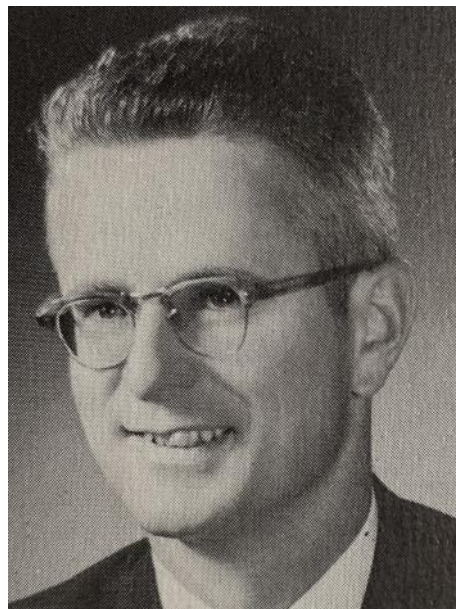


2024 Inductee: Coach

Paul K. "Doc" Sweeney '46

Paul "Doc" Sweeney served for 17 years as a baseball coach in the Woburn School System. He began his coaching career at the junior high level, then went on to coach junior varsity, serve as an assistant varsity coach and then head varsity baseball coach at Woburn High. As varsity baseball coach Paul won one Northeastern Conference championship and two Middlesex League Championships. His team won the State Class B Championship in 1968. That team went 13-1 in the Northeastern Conference and 19-4 overall. His last team in 1970 won the Middlesex league championship and made it to the class A state semifinals. Under his leadership, Woburn's varsity teams had a league record of 59 wins and 33 losses and an overall record of 77 wins and 43 losses.

Paul was a master at motivating young people to do their best and developing them to reach their peak performance either in the classroom or on the playing field. He knew when to push his players, when to encourage them, and when to back off and allow them to play their best. His teams were well-prepared, extremely smart and disciplined, and rarely made mistakes or beat themselves. Players always wanted to play their best for him. For all his contributions to Woburn High School, most especially as a successful and brilliant coach, we are proud to induct Paul K. "Doc" Sweeney into the Woburn Hall of Fame.
